Key future challenges:

- C1: Strengthening the high-tech cluster Brainport
 - building on existing strengths, adding new ones
 - strategy of scaling up, diversification and cross-fertilisation
- C2: Deepening cross-border collaboration
 - ELAt (Eindhoven-Leuven-Aachen triangle) -- and broader
 - funding & matching
 - SME collaboration
- C3: Continuing the success of new style regional development
 - Project-based, co-operative, self-sustaining
 - Brainport Development and Brainport 2020 (strategy 2010)
 - Entrepreneurial discovery 'avant la lettre'
- C4: National & regional policy realigning & rebalancing
 - National: 'topsector' policy (9 sectors); change instrument mix
 - Regional: Decentralisation of powers (provinces!)
 - Reformed cohesion policy 2014-2020 -- S3 can act as 'lever'

Smart specialisation across borders: Flanders and the Netherlands

Future challenges Flanders and the Netherlands:

- C1: Globalisation growing outside world/'shrinking' Low Countries
 - Scale matters in production, R&D, innovation
 - Smart specialisation smart connections between Nieuw industrieel beleid and topsectorenbeleid NL
 - Need for challenging programme(s) "Man on the Moon"
- C2: Metropole axis Amsterdam-Rotterdam-Antwerp-Brussels
 - Logistics smarter and more aligned (water, road, rail)
 - Joint key sectors chemicals, high-tech, food...
- C3: Societal challenges & 'horizontal' challenges
 - Health & care joint challenge VL-NL
 - Labour market skill gaps & shortages, e.g. high-tech domain
 - Education & mobility students/staff
- C4: Financing & programming
 - Increasing matching funds for cross-border collaboration
 - S3: importance far beyond financial frame EU Structural Funds
 - Formulating joint programmes/projects
