



- 1. A paradigm shift:


 'Industry 4.0' = **New Industrial Revolution**'glocalisation': re-industrialisation in Europe
 'sustainable growth': by societal challenges

- Flanders' comptitiveness problem:
 1/3 = explained by labour cost evolution;
 2/3 = by increasing productivity slowdown



- 3. <u>Unexploited resources for a new productivity boost</u>: **cluster development**
 - = open innovation (exploiting knowledge spillovers)
 - = 'economies of integration' in value chains
 - = smart specialisations in new growth markets of the future





- 'Flanders in Action' & 'Pact 2020' (2009): societal challenges as policy drivers! In line with EU 2020 strategy.
- Government-wide adoption of 'transition management' with 'transition managers' for 13 transitions: but ... how to align departments for domain overarching policies?
- Challenge-driven innovation (6 innovation hubs: industrial transformation, green energy, innovation in care, sustainable mobility, eco-innovation, social innovation)
- Different (overlapping) strategic frameworks exist: sustainable development strategy, action plans for transformation NIB, targeted innovation strategy (Innovation Directory Groups), Foresight exercises (S&I Council),
- Need for consolidation of efforts! Transparant governance.

Smart Specialisation: a new approach for focussing transformation

- What are the key clusters? Not 'picking winners'
- Smart specialisation = bottom-up 'self-discovery process'!
- OECD case-studies (2011): sustainable chemistry / Nano4Health = starting from strengths, with different transformation strategies.
- European context: smart specialisation as 'ex ante conditionality'
- Concept Note 'Smart Specialisation Strategy for a targeted cluster policy' (adopted by Flemish Gov, March 2013): method for prioritisation based on:
 - Bottom-up 'entrepreneurial discovery' process in local eco-system
 - International positioning
 - Strategic partnership for the implementation of validated roadmaps

Strategic partnerships between government and spearhead clusters

Instruments of a targeted cluster policy (in development)

- 1. A 'strategic roadmap' that specifies objectives, milestones and commitments will be further developed in cooperation between the spearhead cluster and the Flemish government
- 2. A 'light' management structure will be supported by the Flemish government to strengthen the strategic capacity of the cluster platform
- 3. A 'partnership agreement' will seal a long term commitment of all partners engaged in the execution of the roadmap. Operated via a 'structured dialogue', engaging earmarked budgets in the government instruments, accompanied by 'account managers'.





Roadmapping for identification of smart specialisations


A **roadmap** in the context of New Industrial Policy is

- a **step-by-step plan** for the development of a **new value chain** within a strategy for **smart specialisation**
- with a clear **strategic focus** on industrialisation (e.g. new pilots to demonstrate new solutions and upscale them to the level of manufacturing).
- this roadmap reflects the deployment of an eco-systeem that is required to support this and
- the commitments of all participants
- It is a graphical visualitation of a strategy that oversees objectives and milestones in a mid-term time-frame.

<u>Roadmapping</u> is a structured search <u>process</u> through strategic interaction within and among clusters in order to identify value-creating opportunities and to implement them in strategic pathways

The Vanguard Initiative for New Growth by Smart Specialisation.

- ➤ WHAT an initiative of political leaders of regions that commit to Europe's industrial future supported by smart specialisation, through the development of multi-level European investment and cluster initiatives for emerging and transforming industries in a European growth strategy.
- **WHY** need to deliver on jobs and growth and foster global competitiveness by investments in strategic priority domains for Europe's re-industrialisation (with a focus on new pilot activities).
- ➤ WHO regions with strong **industrial ambitions** and smart specialisation strategies for their structural renewal (beyond the ex-ante conditionality)
- ➤ **HOW** by sharing information to **initiate bottom-up vanguard initiatives**, developing common roadmaps and multi-level approaches to stimulate investment and enabling local clusters with global potential to develop into world-class clusters
- **WHEN** initiated to influence the European Council in February 2014 and future investment opportunities in priority areas for the re-industrialisation of Europe.








Relative specialisation in mature economic sectors

Relative technological specialisation of Flanders (Fraunhofer 35 classification, periods 1998-2001; 2002-2005; 2006-2009)




1. Development of a **Smart specialisation strategy**method for the identification of priority innovation efforts and international cooperations

2. Development of a **Programme for spearhead clusters**

- Consolidation of the innovation and economic cluster landscape in spearhead domains supported by strategic management
- 2. Policy framework for whole-of-government **partnership agreements** for transformation (earmarked budgets and dedicated account managers)
- 3. Organisation of **transversal teams of account managers** to conduct the structured dialogue with these spearheads in the context of the 'transitions'
- 4. Enabling of **cluster organisation** in domains of future strength; and systematic **roadmapping** for European/global smart specialisations + development of **strategic intelligence**
